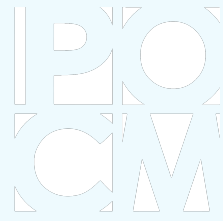

## SAD LOSS

It has been a bit of a whirlwind for us all at POCM this past 2 months. In a call to my mother early in December I realised that her mental health had taken a sudden decline and it gave me great concern. After prayer and discussion with my family here, I felt it was necessary, being the only daughter, to return to the UK to care for mum over the Christmas period. I hadn't been home for Christmas since 1998 and I knew it was a dream of mum's for us to have another Christmas together (although she never asked). By the time I booked the flight, the on-line check in was already open. That's how sudden the decision was. We had completed all our Christmas activities in the prisons, so the rest of the family and ministry team assured me that they could manage the remaining Christmas activities without me. Whilst it was hard leaving children and grandchildren over the Christmas period, it was a wonderful opportunity to be with my parents and to serve them as best I could. I did have a wonderful time with them. Mum seemed to vastly improve while I was home too, which was an added blessing. I needed to return to the Philippines by January 22 as our dear friend (and long time supporter of POCM) Wendy Holmes was coming with friends Michelle (chairman of the charity shop YKATW) and sister-in-law Kate, to visit POCM.

We are currently working hard for our High School to be approved for the school's recognition certificate.

overwhelming sadness that we learned that he was not able to recover after surgery.

Praise God and thanks to our FCM partners in Germany, the need was met and each of the children had their own cash gift to go shopping, even the toddlers had a fun day making their choices. Amid all the excitement of Christmas, it wasn't without its problems. We also struggled with our toddlers as they all got sick. A simple cough and cold quickly progressed to pneumonia and primary infection. Some of the children had to be isolated and we had to get all the houseparents, volunteers and staff checked also. Some of the staff were not able to celebrate the New Year with their families because they were urgently

What a joy to see his smiling face on Christmas Day when he was finally able to join the other children and swim for the first time. It was the icing on the cake.
